First Reading (Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11) Here begins the second part of the Prophet Isaiah, the Book of Consolation. After the justifiable chastisement and warning of the first part, where the people are reminded of where infidelity will bring them, now there begins the promise of a road back to God and the image of a messenger announcing the 'good news' of a new way opening across the desert.

Second Reading (2 Peter 3:8-14) In this reading, the image of the Day of the Lord, so beloved of the Prophetic Tradition, is reinterpreted. It is no longer the imminent day of divine intervention, but rather the ongoing 'day' of God's invitation to humanity to live in his presence through the Son.

Gospel Reading (Mark 1:1-8) The Prologue of Mark gives us a programme for the entire gospel. The image of John here is the image of a 'precursor' a foretaste of what is to

happen when the good news really takes root with Jesus Christ. John's ministry of baptism is merely a prelude to what will happen with Christ: John brings people across the Jordon, symbolically restoring them to the Land of the Promise; but Christ will bring them further
