COVID-19 & FACE MASKS IN CHURCH

TRÓCAIRE has written to thank parishioners for your generosity to the 2021 Lenten Appeal. Almost £5 million was raised in Northern Ireland. The final total for the 2021 Lenten Appeal was £4,861,548. This includes the £2 million in extra funding that has been approved by the UK government, which had pledged to match public donations in Northern Ireland up to a maximum of £2 million.

"Once again we asked the people of Northern Ireland to stand in solidarity with those in the developing world and, despite everything going on here in relation to Covid-19, the public stepped up to the plate.... We never cease to be amazed and humbled by the generosity of people here at home. Last year Trócaire supported 2.7 million people in 25 countries. This would not have been possible without the support of people in Northern Ireland.

Letter from Bishop Treanor: DIOCESAN APPEAL FOR THE DOWN AND CONNOR PRIESTS' WELFARE FUND

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the past 18 months the normal rhythm of our lives has been affected in so many ways. Many things we took for granted were no longer readily available to us, and, as families, workers and communities, we sought out new ways to live life. Our life as a praying and worshiping community was ruptured too. We all felt the absence of gathering as the family of God, but we adapted to new ways of uniting in prayer. We are most grateful for your generosity to your parish and to the diocese at a time when many people faced and continue to face their own financial struggles.

In the diocese of Down and Connor, the Priests' Welfare Fund exists to provide the stipend for each priest in active ministry. Your generosity over many years has ensured that the Fund had sufficient reserves to continue to provide a stipend for each priest, even where parish stipend offerings decreased significantly.

On Sunday 19th September 2021 we are asking for your financial support towards the annual autumn voluntary collection for our priests. We make this appeal to ensure that the Fund can continue to sustain that support.

We make this appeal in the light of the fact that during 2020 the level of giving across our parishes dropped on average by 35% to 50%. This decrease was experienced across all aspects of financial support for the many services provided by our parishes and the diocese e.g. Pastoral Care and Services and Sacramental Ministries in our parishes; the Living Church initiative, Family Ministry, Vocations Commission, Diocesan Youth Commission, Safeguarding & Vetting, Chaplaincies to Hospitals, Prisons, Universities), Living Youth, ACCORD, Family Care Society and the Diocesan Curia. Together with the priests of the diocese I thank you for your kindness and ongoing support and for your generous response to this appeal in support of your priests.




restarted Foodbank collections in August. We anticipate that in time we can return to pre-Covid volumes - concentrating on Toiletries and Cleaning Products. We distribute donations via partner organisations who deal directly with individuals and families in our community. Recently we received a thank you from Carol Reynolds, the organiser of Foodstore @ Cooke, on Park Road, one of the outlets for our collections. We thought that we should share Carol's comments with you and an outline of their work. Carol writes that "Holy Rosary Parish contributions have been very welcome and are put to good use". When Foodstore @ Cooke restarted after lockdown, it operated solely with Women's Aid, who care for women and their children without a home, food, or income at very short notice. Within a few months, Cooke has expanded this outreach through partnerships with Ballynafeigh Community Development and Ark Housing Associations. Ark Housing Association manages the Rossville House refuge in Rossmore Drive. Some occupants of Rossville House are refugees or asylum seekers who arrive with nothing and need help until they receive permanent aid. The donations from Holy Rosary and other local churches allow Cooke to support families and individuals in the Ballynafeigh area who are struggling financially and need assistance. Cooke distributed 28 food packets in July and August. The standard food package they provide includes: tins of meat, fish and vegetables; tea, coffee, sugar, pasta, rice, breakfast cereals, soup, fruit cordial, toiletries and cleaning products. To the long-life products, they try to add milk, bread, butter, eggs, and fruit. This is only one of the distribution partnerships that we have established to disperse your generous donations. We hope that you will continue to support us".
