First Reading (2 Samuel 5:1-3) This reading comes from the golden age of the Jewish monarchy with the anointing of David and subsequently his son, Solomon. What is the nature of leadership? How can the will of God be best expressed in the one who leads? Two points of interest: Firstly, the qualities of a king; to be a shepherd and a commander. The second point of interest is the manner in which he is chosen; the mandate from God, affirmed firstly by the tribes and then in agreement with the elders.

Second Reading (2 Colossians 1:12-20) It seems appropriate at the end of the year to give thanks to God. This letter was sent to this small city in Asia Minor around the year A.D. 80, while Paul was in prison. The affirmation of the power of God seems as much for Paul's benefit as for ours. God rescues us from darkness; redeems us and forgives our sins. The second part of the reading is a hymn of praise to Jesus Christ.

Gospel Reading (Luke 23:35-43) The gospel finds us at Calvary. Despite everything that Jesus has endured, he now has to cope with the taunts of the bystanders, the soldiers and one of the criminals. To borrow the image from the first reading, they think they are executing a commander; but Jesus is a shepherd. From his first appearance at the Jordan and in the Synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus has spoken of a different type of kingdom. Every time he has used the phrase, 'the kingdom of heaven might be compared to,' there is the anticipation of this kingdom. When he speaks finally to the thief, this anticipation comes to its completion in the promise of paradise.

### **Eucharistic Adoration**

The Diocesan Eucharistic Adoration Apostolate will visit St. Bernadette's next weekend for a renewal of the Parish Adoration. Exposition of the **Blessed Sacrament** takes place each Tuesday in the Lourdes Chapel from **8a.m.** until **7.15p.m.** Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament has brought so many graces to our Parish and to the lives of the 40 or so people who attend each week. "Will you give a little of your time to be in the very presence of Our Lord?"


