Much of it concerns political corruption, treachery and murder - generally carried out by proxies. Sadly, at present we are not unfamiliar with murders and serious crime carried out by proxies on the streets of our capital city.

Second Reading (Ephesians 5:8-14) Here Saint Paul is urging the Ephesians to live virtuous lives – lives of goodness, justice and truth. Further on in the chapter he exhorts husbands and wives to love each other. However, he also suggests in the same context that the wife should fear her husband. An attempt can be made to explain this comment as intelligible in the cultural environment in which it was written. Today such a view is rightly regarded as unacceptable as – unless fear is interpreted to mean love and respect - indeed it always was and is

Gospel Reading (John 9:1-41) Here we find two attitudes, that of co-operation and that of rejection. The blind man allowed Christ to touch his eyes with the clay and spittle. He also followed Christ's instructions to wash in the pool of Siloe. From the Pharisees there was nothing but rejection. They refused to believe the blind man's account of the incident. Nor would they accept the version given them by the blind man's parents. One is reminded of the truism: 'There are none so blind as those who are determined not to see'. All of us are given the opportunity to accept or reject the gift of faith, grace, God's friendship. © Intercom 2017

Every time we receive the sacraments Jesus comes to us by touching our senses and there is a visible sign of Jesus coming to us invisibly through his sacrament. Who would think that anointing with oil would be the signal for the Spirit of the Lord to fall mightily on David? Who would think that anointing with a paste of clay and washing would restore sight? But God uses the ordinary elements of nature to convey his power and healing to us in the sacraments. In every sacrament Jesus comes to us invisibly but powerfully.
