First Reading (Isaiah 63:16-17, 64:1, 3-8) This reading from Isaiah should be read as a prayer in the vein of the lament psalms. There are acknowledgements of human fault and sinfulness that have left the people 'like withered leaves in the wind' – but there is a greater sense of the mercy of God, who will act dramatically to restore his people, even to the extent of tearing open the heavens.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 1:3-9) The thanksgiving at the beginning is a set piece of the Pauline letter and normally gives a hint of some of the key issues to be addressed in the letter. Here Paul gives thanks for the graces that have enriched this community, particularly in the gift of good teachers and leaders. Yet these very leaders have also been the source of divisions, so Paul changes the perspective from one of narrow focus on the giftedness of certain leaders to the need for us all to prepare for the coming of Christ.

Gospel Reading (Mark 13:33-37) A question that governs the entirety of this chapter: what will be the sign that all is about to be accomplished? (13:4). There is no code or specific portent. Instead, Christ offers some reflections on human realities that happen in the course of history, from persecutions to natural disasters to false interpretations of these events. For believers, waiting for specific signs is a fool's game. Christ exhorts his people rather to an attitude of vigilance and reflection, to discover how the Master might be returning to his house in ways missed by a sleeping watchman. Being caught up in reading patterns and codes will mislead some people, but Christ asks that his followers might not so much adopt a fearful suspicion, but rather that they learn to live with an attentiveness as to how Christ might be present to his people. © Intercom

The Season of Advent

Today we begin the new liturgical year in the Church and set out on our Advent journey in preparation for the birth of Our Lord on Christmas Day.

Each Sunday the **Jesse Tree** will be decorated with symbols that remind us of the purpose and promises of God from Creation to the Birth of Jesus Christ. Jesse was the father of King David and God promised David that his Kingdom would last forever.

The circle of the Advent Wreath signifies continuous life which has no beginning or end, the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. The three purple and the rose candles represent 1,000 years each - 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Saviour. The progressive lighting of the candles each week signifies the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead.

The celebrant will wear purple vestments during Advent to remind us that Advent, like Lent is also a time for prayer, penance, preparatory sacrifices, and good works.

Parish Carol Service




