First Reading (Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7) This is the classic account of the fall from grace of Adam and Eve. I recall a tour-guide standing before a full-length picture of the incident, pointing to the apple and the serpent and commenting that it was a pity our first parents were not Chinese, as then they would have eaten the serpent and not the apple. We tend to joke about the Fall but it highlights and makes us aware of our moral frailty.

Second Reading (Romans 5:12-19) Internal evidence would indicate that St Paul was somewhat forbidding and censorious. He was certainly outspoken when condemning sin and sinners. But it is clear here he was equally forthright when emphasising the redemptive effect of the life and death of Christ. What we learn from St Paul is to strive always to be fair and balanced in our comments and judgments on others.

Gospel Reading (Matthew 4:1-11) At his Baptism, Our Lord received into his soul the fullness of the Holy Spirit and immediately after the Baptism he was moved by the inspiration of the same Holy Spirit to retire into the desert for a period of forty days during which he fasted and was tempted by the devil. The temptations are not to be understood simply as temptations to sensuality, vanity and ambition. They seem to be concerned more with aspects of Our Lord's messianic mission. In the temptations we see the first formal clash between the 'Prince of this World' and the genuine Messiah, between the wholly material messianism of Judiasm and the kingdom of justice and holiness which Christ has been sent to establish.



Reflection

The traditional penitential practices of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. So, of course, anything that you "give up for Lent" fits into the category of a fast. Fast from chocolate, if you want. Fast from swearing or alcohol. Fast from anything you want. But remember that its absence from the next 40 days of your life is a penance, an expression of your love of God, and of your need to be more focused on God than on yourself. So, too, when we add a new discipline of prayer ...we direct our focus more to God and away from self than before. Almsgiving puts our focus upon our neighbor in need, and so also brings us to discover God in "the least of these." May the penances we do this Lent help us to grow in love for God and for neighbour, and bear fruit in our lives, in the life of the Church, and the life of the world. **Dana Dillon**.
