First Reading (Isaiah 60:1-6) The prophet Isaiah calls upon Israel to brighten up, since in her darkness, Israel fails to see the new light shining from her. Jerusalem, although in darkness, will see kings and nations come to her bearing treasures but it will not be Jerusalem they will come to visit; but the new light shining forth from Israel, a light that will encompass all peoples as the new Israel of God,

Second Reading (Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6) Only through the Holy Spirit can the 'apostles' and new 'prophets' understand the fulfilment of the covenant between God and Abraham regarding a new nation and the even more ancient covenant between God and Noah; representing the new creation, in the birth of this child. It is in the Church of Christ that the new star has risen and shines forth over all the world.

Gospel Reading (Matthew 2:1-12) The Gentile Magi arrive in Jerusalem having followed the rising of a new star; whilst Israel remains blind to its light. Seeking the new king leads to Herod's murderous plans; but led by the star, the Magi arrive in Bethlehem bearing treasures for the Child and his holy Mother. This event prefigures the election of the Gentiles and indeed, often Christ will find greater faith among non-believers than in Israel. As the Gentile Magi came to pay homage to Christ; in time, Christ's disciples will baptise the Gentile nations into the one Church. ©Intercom
