First Reading (Genesis 14:18-20) The first reading recounts how a pagan priest-king named Melchizedek, King of Salem (probably a shortened form for the name Jerusalem), comes to greet Abraham with an offering of bread and wine and pronounces a blessing over him. The rite celebrated here is some form of thanksgiving offering, probably for Abraham's victory over his foes. In Christian tradition the offering of bread and wine are taken to prefigure the bread and wine of the Eucharist.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 11:23-26) St. Paul's account of the institution of the Eucharist is the earliest written account. The language used is technical and clearly formulated. Moreover, the manner of expression indicates the ecclesial authority of the teaching. The recital of the words of Jesus establishes that the account comes specifically from the Jesus tradition. One point in all of this is very clear; the followers of Jesus were charged to repeat what Jesus had done at the Last Supper. This re-enactment in the 'tip-off' that these people are authentic disciples.

Gospel Reading (Luke 9:11-17) Wherever Jesus was present there was always an abundance of food, wine, fish, healing, compassion and forgiveness, just to name some instances. In this passage from Luke, the munificence is again encountered. Jesus takes the loaves and fish and shows that the little they have is enough to answer the hunger of the crowd. In telling the story Luke uses the language associated with the Eucharist as he tells of Jesus 'blessing', 'breaking' and handing to his disciples. The miracle of the multiplication foreshadows the action of Jesus at the Last Supper where he instituted the Eucharistic celebration in which we participate in his self-giving, sacrificial love and endeavour to live the meaning of that celebration in our day to day living.



F Reflection

As well as remembering and giving thanks as a community, as the Body of Christ, the Eucharist is also a time when we express that unity through the eating and drinking together of that Body. The key to our being in Christ is love, love not only for God, but for every single person. Jesus said that the two ways by which it would be known publicly that we live in him would be by our love for each other and the unity which follows from that. "By this will all know that you are my disciples, that you have love one for another" (John 13:35) and "May they all be one... may they be so completely one that the world will realise that it was you [the Father] who **sent me**" (John 17:21,23). ©1999- 2016 Living Space

St. Elisabeth Convent



The Orthodox Sisters from the St. Elisabeth Convent in Belarus, will visit the church on next Wednesday to promote their work and to sell religious goods to help fund their ministry with special needs children and vulnerable adults. The sisters provide spiritual and social help to the sick and the suffering. In fact, since it was founded over 15 years ago, the Convent has been supporting more than 200 orphans with special needs. Our assistance stretches from purchasing diapers for the bedridden children to their rehabilitation and socialization. About ten years ago, the Convent established a rehab center where socially vulnerable and disadvantaged people can find support, spiritual care and shelter. Today, there are about 300 people undergoing rehabilitation at the center. Please spare some time after morning Mass on Wedneday to meet the sisters and buy something from their stall in the **Main Porch** of the church.
