Second Reading (Romans 15:4-9) Treating each other with profound reverence and respect: imagine what this means with people we know. Only then are we truly doing the Lord's work and will.

Gospel Reading (Matthew 3:1-12) The dramatic, colourful persona of John the Baptist emerging from the wilderness, calling us to join the circus, become acrobats, perform somersaults, turn our lives completely around: this is repentance.



Calendar of Feasts

Thursday 8th. December is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is a Holy Day of Obligation. The Vigil Mass will be at 7.30p.m. on Wednesday and at 9.30a.m. on Thursday.

Immaculate Conception refers to the condition that Our Lady was free from **Original Sin** from the very moment of her conception in the womb of her mother, St. Anne. It is the concrete expression of God's love for Mary, who gave herself fully, completely, and without hesitation to His service.

Reparing for Christmas

Each Sunday the Jesse Tree is decorated with symbols that remind us of the purpose and promises of God from Creation to the Birth of Jesus Christ. Jesse was the father of King David and God promised David that his Kingdom would last forever.

The circle of the **Advent Wreath** signifies continuous life which has no beginning or end, the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. The three purple and the rose candle represent 1,000 years each - 4,000years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Saviour. The progressive lighting of the candles signifies the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead.

The Data Protection Act places restrictions on who has a right to access the information in our sacramental registers. From time to time, many people find it necessary to request a copy of a Certificate of Baptism, or a record of their Confirmation or Marriage in Church. Most commonly, this will be in connection with a marriage or a school application.

In order to comply with the requirements of the Data Protection Act, all such requests need to be made in writing and certificates can only be issued to those named on the record - for instance, the person who was baptised, or, in the case of someone under the age of 16, their parent or guardian.

Because requests need to be signed and a written record retained of all requests for access to our sacramental registers, we are unable to accept requests by telephone or e-mail.

To request a certificate confirming entry in one of the church registers, please complete the form in PDF format on the Parish website: www.stbernadettesparish.org and post it to St. Bernadette's Parish, 28 Willowbank Park, Belfast BT6 0LL or leave it in the Sacristy at Mass times. Forms are also available from the Sacristy, the Lourdes Chapel porch, and in the Parish Centre.

Reflections on the daily Mass readings during Advent are available at the back of the church. It only takes a few moments to read them each day and anything which helps to direct our minds to a spiritual preparation for Christmas is more than worthwhile.
