First Reading (Isaiah 8:23-9:3) In the opening words of this reading, there is an entire history of God's workings: God is always doing a new thing. There are days now past, with their successes and their failures, their humiliations and their 'learning curves.' Yet we are assured that 'in the days to come,' God will act anew. There is no stagnation for those who look to God.

Second Reading (Corinthians 1:10-13.17) St. Paul's first task, in writing to the immature Christians at Corinth, is to urge them to overcome their factions and divisions. This is very telling! Paul wants them to hear the rest of his exhortations as a single, united, listening community.

Gospel (Matthew 4:12-23) If the Gospel is called 'Good News,' then why is 'repent' the first word Jesus speaks in his public ministry? There is no contradiction here, because 'repent' is not a threat; it is an invitation to turn to God's grace, to leave the darkness and walk in the light. ©Intercom

Word of God Sunday

Pope Francis has established that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be Sunday of the 'Word of God.' The Pope is clear that the relationship between the Risen Lord, a community of believers, and sacred Scripture is essential to who we are as Christians. The Word of God builds on the texts and prayers of the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, being conscious that it comes just after the celebration of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. We are reminded that while we are not yet united around the table of the Eucharist for Holy Communion we do share on many Sundays of the year the same scriptural readings in our different Christian assemblies. We are urged to continue to pray for Christian unity.

Practical things to do:

- Read and reflect on the Sunday Scriptures before coming to Mass (this is prayer); or come a little early to Sunday Mass, and using the Sunday Missalette, quietly read through the Readings before Mass begins;
- During the week think back to the Sunday Mass and recall the scriptures you heard - reflect for a moment on any sentence or thought that made an impact on you at that time;
- Volunteer to read the Word of God at Sunday Mass.
