First Reading (Jeremiah 33:14-16) In the midst of prophesies concerning exile and displacement, Jeremiah offers the hope of ultimate restoration and a fresh start for God's chosen people. Just as their downfall had been due to corrupt and misguided governance, so their hopes for renewal will centre upon an altogether new kind of leadership, in which the lineage of King David will be restored. Honesty, integrity and faithfulness to God's covenant will be the hallmarks of this renewal, rather than any conventional form of political revival.

Second Reading (Thessalonians 3:12-4:2) Writing to the largely gentile converts who made up the Christian community in Thessalonica, Paul encourages their perseverance. Timothy has returned from visiting the Thessalonians with very positive accounts, for Paul, of their fidelity. This has lifted Paul's heart. He looks forward to seeing them again and, meanwhile, exhorts them to continue their efforts in the Christian life and its demands. This letter is traditionally viewed as being Paul's earliest and, therefore, the oldest writing in the New Testament.

Gospel Reading (Luke 21:25-28, 34-36) This eschatological discourse, or sermon on the things to come, effectively draws the public ministry of Jesus to a close in each of the Synoptics. Remarks, by onlookers, on the grandeur of the Temple provoke a reaction from Jesus, prophesying its destruction. Jesus foretells the terrors which will be visited upon Jerusalem and the world around it, in advance of the final coming of the 'Son of Man'. The Season of Advent

Today we begin the new liturgical vear in the Church and set out on our Advent journey in preparation for the birth of Our Lord. Advent, like Lent is a time for prayer, penance, sacrifices, and good works.

The Jesse Tree will be decorated with symbols that remind us of the purpose and promises of God from Creation to the Birth of Jesus Christ. Jesse was the father of King David and God promised David that his Kingdom would last forever.

The Advent Wreath signifies continuous life which has no beginning or end, the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. The three purple and the rose candles represent 1,000 years each - 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Saviour. The progressive lighting of the candles each week signifies the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead.

The special **Advent Calendar** has been produced by the Parish Pastoral Council to help guide us on our spiritual journey through Advent.
