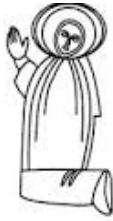

An opportunity has arisen within the Diocesan Safeguarding Office, where we seek to recruit into the role of Parish Safeguarding Support Officer. This role will be based within the Safeguarding Office at 120 Cliftonville Road, Belfast and will work as part of the Diocesan Safeguarding Team, to ensure that the Diocesan Trust fulfils its statutory duties with regards to the Safeguarding of Children and Adults.

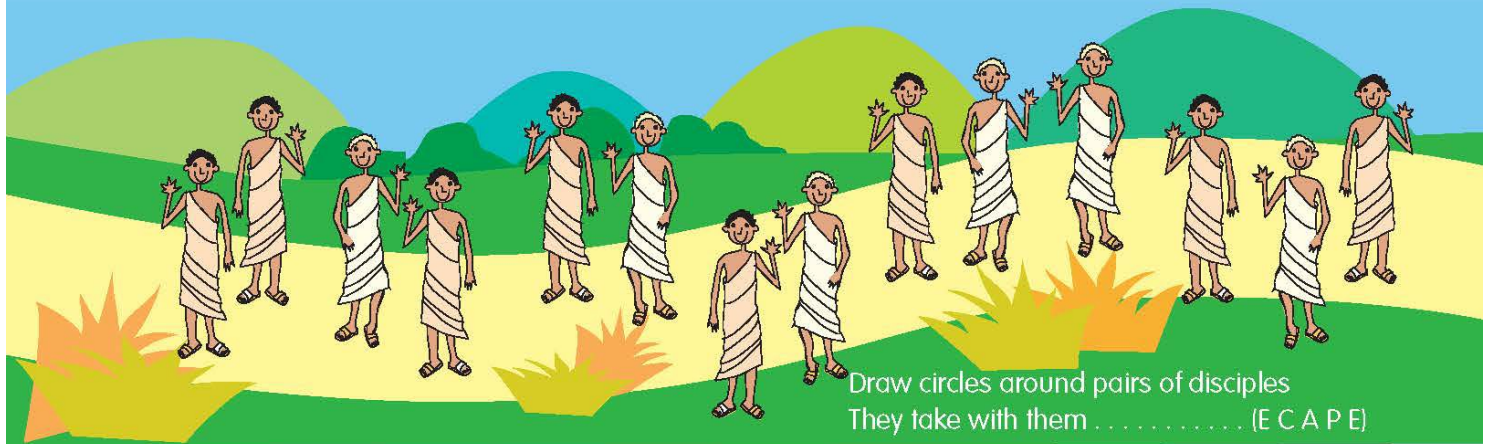

He told them to work in pairs (in T S O W)



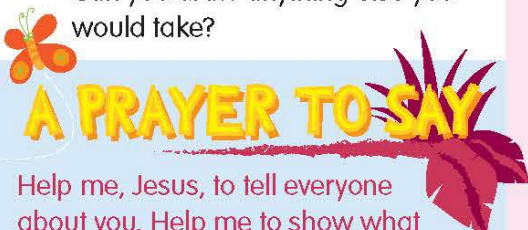
Draw circles around pairs of disciples

Help me, Jesus, to tell everyone about you. Help me to show what you are like and spread your peace by being kind and loving. Amen.

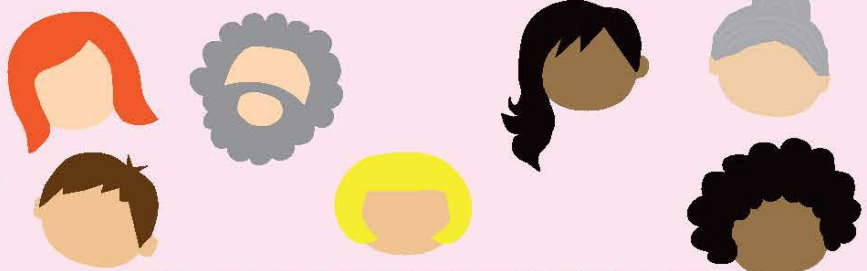
